In January 2025, Reabetswe returned to CTC for her trade preparation, culminating in a significant milestone in her career. On April 24, 2025, she proudly qualified as a Millwright Artisan, marking the achievement of a long-term goal. JOURNEY OF RESILIENCE: THE INSPIRATIONAL STORY OF SWGC ALUMNI JABULILE TSHABALALA

Jabulile Tshabalala, a visually impaired woman born and raised in Mofolo South Soweto, has become a beacon of resilience and determination. Currently residing in Zakareyya Park, Johannesburg, her journey through education and professional development showcases the power of perseverance in the face of adversity.

In 2015, Jabulile embarked on her academic journey at the South West Gauteng TVET College Dobsonville Campus, enrolling in the Public Management Nated Programme. It was here that she discovered the disability unit, where she met Ms. Bongiwe Leleballo, who would play a crucial role in her education. As the Senior Officer of the disability unit, Bongiwe provided invaluable support, arranging mobility training for visually impaired students and ensuring they had access to essential tools like laptops with speech programs, headsets, voice recorders, and scanned study materials.

Despite facing significant challenges, particularly in the computer literacy subject, where educators struggled to adapt their teaching methods, Jabulile persevered. She completed her studies from N4 to N6 in record time, except for Computer Literacy N6, which she had to retake in 2020. Her dedication paid off when she successfully passed the course later that year.

Jabulile's journey continued to flourish as she secured her first internship at Thuthukisa Consulting and Advisory in November 2021. After completing this opportunity in September 2023, she sought further experience and landed a second internship at the Germiston Family Court in October 2023. Her internship was supported by individuals like Mr. Coka, Lele, and Lucia, who believed in her potential.

During her four-month tenure at Germiston, Jabulile completed office administrative tasks under Area Court Manager Ms. Julia Mokoala. Eager to learn, she expressed her interest in observing court proceedings, which guided her to explore her passion for interpretation. With fluency in IsiZulu, IsiXhosa, Sepedi, English, and Afrikaans, Jabulile's language skills caught the attention of the Provincial Princi-

pal Interpreter, leading to her swearing-in as an interpreter on April 23, 2024.

After her internship ended, Jabulile's dedication and talent led her to Palm Ridge Court, where she continued to refine her interpreting skills. Her journey included a two-month observation at Lenesia Magistrate Court, where she encountered a supportive community. In October 2024, she was officially appointed as a casual interpreter at Palm Ridge Magistrate Court, fulfilling her dream of becoming an interpreter.

Jabulile's story is not just one of personal achievement, but also of the many people who have contributed to her success. She attributes her confidence and growth to mentors like Ms. Yonela Sobeko, Mr. Percy Lekalakala, and Ms. Sengwayo, who provided encouragement and opportunities.

Today, Jabulile is passionate about her work and treasures the supportive environment at Palm Ridge Court, where she feels embraced like family. Her journey serves as a testament to the importance of hard work, resilience, and the unwavering belief that persistence can lead to rewarding outcomes.
